A6 Final Project Proposal

You will turn in a proposal for the final assignment. You will turn in a proposal for your final project that will describe and address the following:

Your answers must be typed.

1. What is your topic? subject matter? Theme?
2. Describe in detail what exactly you are going to shoot images of.
3. What do you want to communicate to the audience?
4. Are you interested in a specific style? If so, describe that style.
5. Will your series have a narrative quality? If so, summarize the narrative for me.
6. Write about what you will have to do physically and technically to achieve the images you desire. List:
 - Shooting considerations like depth of field, lens focal length, Shutter speed and motion considerations, etc.
 - Lighting considerations like use of flash, daylight, studio, etc.
 - Post-production considerations like black and white, color, enhancements, etc.
 - Printing considerations like paper type

List at least one item for each category above.

Example from 2014:

My subject is Skateboarding Culture and Skateboarding Action Shots. I want to shoot images that could appear in a skateboarding magazine or advertise products as well as capture the individuals who do the sport.

I will go to local places where people do tricks, or to people's homes where they have made ramps and rails to perform tricks. I want to show people the cool moves and also capture the emotion of the people as they succeed and / or fail at the moves. The narrative is the group hanging out and supporting each other trying to get better at their sport.

I want to have kind of a "grunge" look that is high contrast, harsh light, direct flash, and kind of gritty. Shooting at higher ISO will help the gritty look. Shooting with Wide Angle Lens will give me a distortion that I want. I might lower the color saturation in Lightroom to make a faded look. I plan to shoot at night and light with a combination of available street light and direct flash. I would like to make large prints like 16"x20". I want to shoot portraits and pair them with action shots in a layout in Photoshop. They will be printed together as one print.
